



How to reach Petit Prêtre Lakes?

After leaving the Euro Tunnel / Car Ferry Terminal the main direction to follow is **Reims** and please do remember to drive on the right side of the road!

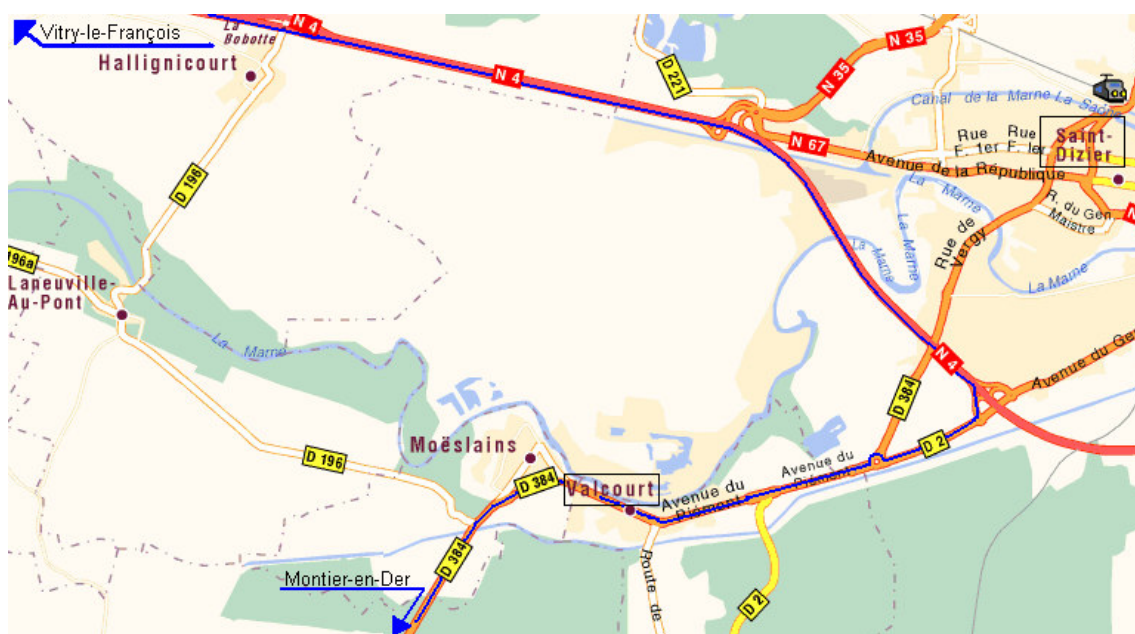
Take the A16 (E402) and after about 5 km the A26 (E15), heading towards Reims. The speed limits are as advertised 56 mph (90 km/h) on normal roads, 67 mph (110 km/h) on dual carriageways and 67 mph (110 km/h) or 80 mph (130 km/h) on the motorways depending on weather.

Follow the A26 for over 160 miles (250 km). You'll have driven for over 2 hours so if want to take a break Reims is worth a visit (the Cathedral of Reims is on the UNESCO World Heritage List).

After Reims head towards **Châlons-en-Champagne** (or Châlons-sur-Marne: as it used to be called some 30 years ago (but why change the signs right away?)) taking the A4 (E17).

At exit 27 you'll leave the motorway and continue on the N44, heading towards Châlons-en-Champagne and **Vitry-le-François**.

Just before reaching Vitry-le-François take the second exit on the roundabout towards **St-Dizier** (N4).



There are several ways to go from here, so please follow your SatNav's directions or the following (see plan above): Continue to follow the N4, which will take you to the south side of St-Dizier.

Take exit (D2) towards **Montier-en-Der**. At the roundabout take the first exit (D2). After only 800 metres at the second roundabout take the second exit (D384).

Pass Valcourt and head towards Montier-en-Der.

From the Centre of Montier-en-Der follow the D4 in the direction of **La Varnière** and Wassy.

The D4 takes a sharp left in La Varnière, but you must go straight over the junction onto the D173 in the direction of **Robert-Magny**.

Follow this road for about 2 km. You'll pass some farm buildings on your left and after a further 200 metres there's a right-hand bend in the road. Turn left at this point onto a single-track private road. Continue for about 100 metres and the entrance to the **Petit Prêtre Lakes** is on your right.
